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## A-Ras-El Jamal Overview



#### Brief

This report provides a comprehensive set of indicators and information conditions in Ras el -jamal, in order to study the impact of the restoration


Ras el Jamal is an integrated part of the historical core of Tyr old city located at southern peak of Tyr old city peninsula, it is considered of a high archeological , natural , economic and social values.

Adjacent to the main archeological site of the city , the road to Ras el-Jamal and constitute the continuity of the costal promenade , implemented earlier in the CHUD works phase 1 in Tyr old city ,

the length of the road leading to Ras el-Jamal zone estimated around 500m with an average of 4m width , while the total area of Ras el-Jamal zone is estimated 6000m2 the Ras el-jamal zone is extremely lively in the summer , the restaurant-lodges in Ras el-jamal attract large number of visitors and offer dozen of jobs opportunities to the local , however these restaurant-lodges are misplaced , occupy the natural shore and participate in the pollution of sea due to the lack of proper infrastructure in the area



Service area: 50 m2 Terrace: 230 m2 Occupancy: 190 ppl

This restaurant has a direct access to a calm swimming area through the main terrace as shown below

















This restaurant has a direct access to a swimming area from the north side

















This restaurant has a direct access to a swimming area through a kind of terrace extension on sand and water as shown on the right

















This restaurant has a direct access to a fishing area not through the terrace











This restaurant is located at the tip of peninsula it has the best view and its terrace is a direct access for the diving activities area





This restaurant has a direct access to a fishing area not through the main terrace and natural extension on rock and water as shown below





















#### **Actual Site Condition and Issues**

- Lack of clearly designated and accessible public space
- Encroachment on the public coastal line
- Restaurants create visual barrier between the central area and the shore
- Limited access for the public to the shore
- Unorganized aspect of the site
- Neglected landscape behind the restaurants
- Priority for vehicular access over pedestrian access
- Terraces affecting the natural maritime landscape
- Waste endangering maritime species
- Terraces and restaurants of different sizes, shapes and materials
- Lack of security / safety measures (lighting, security booth, railing...)
- Unrealized full potential of this distinctive site



## The main platform


Minimal landscaping is envisaged for the inner area featuring a small parking for services and the handicapped with a drop-off zone, a lightly paved pedestrian area preserving the natural soil, and proper lighting that has a low visual impact.





## The main promenade

An accessible pedestrian public promenade (corniche) is created to allow the public to enjoy the beautiful nature of the site and link all project's services and spaces with each other





## The green slope

A green slope is added to provide a close-to-nature transition between the upper platform and the promenade at a lower level.







## The final site plan

The restaurants are re-designed and redistributed in the same area taking into consideration minimal impact on the site while providing for close-to-water private terraces.





















RESTAURANT KIOSK TYPE B PLAN


